Walking in Alignment with God's Plan

Chapter 1: The Path of Obedience and Divine Purpose

Good morning. Praise God.

Let's take a moment to reflect—God always has a plan. A plan to take you from where you are to where you need to be. There is a specific place where you are assigned to be, where the blessing is. Your obedience aligns you with God's promise and provision. The Holy Spirit within us causes us to will and to do according to His purpose. Obedience is the key to positioning ourselves within the flow of God's blessings.

Why is it so important to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit? Because He is aligning us with the provision God has already prepared. Ephesians 2:10 in the Amplified Bible declares:

"For we are God's own handiwork, His workmanship, recreated in Christ Jesus (born anew) that we may do those good works which God predestined (planned beforehand) for us, taking paths which He prepared ahead of time, that we should walk in them—living the good life which He prearranged and made ready for us to live."

Use It or Lose It

The emphasis today is on a principle that applies not only to our spiritual walk but to every area of life: *use it or lose it*.

It is often said that once you learn how to ride a bike, you never forget. However, when it comes to spiritual gifts, if they remain dormant, their life and effectiveness diminish. While it is not impossible to revive them, it requires intense recommitment, faithfulness, and focus.

God has designed His gifts to be like rivers of living water—flowing continuously. When we suppress our gifts, we become stagnant, much like a body of water that is dammed up. Jesus reminds us in Matthew 5:15:

"Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house."

If we hide our gifts and calling, we stagnate. God intends for us to live in the overflow, allowing His Spirit to flow freely through us.

A New Creation in Christ

When we are born again, we are made new. Before salvation, we were separated from God, strangers to His covenant, lacking the Holy Spirit. But through Christ, we are recreated—a brand-new human species in Him. Our purpose is not something we must invent for ourselves. Rather, we are God's idea, created to fulfill His divine purpose.

Many people ask, *Why am I here? What is my purpose?* But the truth is, we were designed to fulfill *His* dream, not our own. The old life is often about survival—seeking to avoid trouble, living for personal comfort. But in Christ, we have a higher calling. We are set on a preordained path, one that is narrow yet filled with God's divine guidance.

Psalm 23 reminds us that even as we walk through the valley of the shadow of death, we need not fear, for God is with us. Though the path may seem narrow, unseen forces—angels, divine guidance—are protecting and directing us toward His will.

The Role of the Holy Spirit

God has seen the entirety of our lives. He is the Alpha and Omega, and He knows why we are here. Moreover, He knows that we cannot fulfill His purpose alone. That is why He has given us the Holy Spirit.

In Ephesians, Paul tells us that the Holy Spirit is the seal of God, much like an engagement ring. He is the promise of our union with Christ. The Church is the bride of Christ, and the Holy Spirit is our engagement seal, preparing us for that divine relationship. Until we acknowledge His role and grant Him permission to live through us, we will not walk in the fullness of our calling.

Submission and Unity in Christ

Jesus is the head of the Church, but often, the body tries to dictate to the head rather than submitting. True unity in the Church is not about denominational alignment but about submission to Christ. When we are properly aligned with Jesus, we are naturally aligned with one another.

John 17 records Jesus 'prayer that we would become one as He and the Father are one. The goal is not mere cooperation, but a deep, abiding union with God. If we do not cultivate this intimacy through prayer and obedience, we will struggle to be in the right place at the right time.

Faith and Commitment

Faith is not just a passive belief but an active confidence in God's character and ability. Many people say they believe in God's promises, but faith requires *commitment*. There is a difference between believing as a concept and *being persuaded* in such a way that it transforms our actions.

A husband does not enter marriage with half-hearted conviction; he is fully persuaded that his spouse is the one he is committing his life to. Likewise, faith requires full persuasion and commitment to God's promises. Mark 9:24 records the plea, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief." This reveals the internal struggle—faith versus doubt. Faith is placing full confidence in God's ability and stepping forward in commitment.

When Jesus spoke about activating the miraculous, He said, "Have faith in God." Faith is about absolute trust in His ability to do what He said He would do. It is not enough to merely acknowledge His power; we must walk in it, using the gifts He has given us.

Use It or Lose It

To operate in the power of God, we must actively engage with the divine pathway He has set before us. As Jesus teaches in John 14, faith in God aligns us with His kingdom, ensuring that we lack nothing. The kingdom of God is fully resourced, but it requires our participation and agreement with His will.

Jesus emphasized this truth when He responded to Philip's request to see the Father:

"Have I been with you all this time, and you still don't know who I am?" (John 14:9, TPT).
