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(0:01 – 1:00) Introduction & Opening Prayer

- The speaker welcomes the audience and opens in prayer, asking God to anoint the message and download revelation knowledge.
 - Emphasis is placed on believers becoming disciples—those who follow Jesus and learn from His life and teachings.
 - Reference:
John 10:10 (NKJV) – *"The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly."*
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(1:01 – 4:20) Foundation Scripture: Ephesians 6

- **Ephesians 6:10–18 (TPT)** is read and broken down in detail, emphasizing spiritual warfare and the components of the armour of God:
 - Be infused with strength through union with Christ.
 - Put on God's complete armour to stand against the enemy's strategies.
 - Combat is not with people but with demonic principalities.
 - Each piece of armour has a spiritual function:
 - **Belt of truth**
 - **Breastplate of righteousness/holiness**
 - **Shoes of peace**
 - **Shield of faith** (extinguishes fiery arrows)
 - **Helmet of salvation** (protects thought life)
 - **Sword of the Spirit** (spoken Word of God)

- **Prayer** is essential—constant, Spirit-led intercession for believers.
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(4:21 – 7:12) Key Concepts in Spiritual Warfare

- The Word of God is the **blueprint of authority** for believers.
 - The **Holy Spirit brings power ("dunamis")** to the spoken Word.
 - Revelation makes the Word alive in the believer and effective when spoken.
 - Reference:
Revelation 1:6 (KJV) – *"And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen."*
 - As **kings**, believers rule by decrees. The spoken Word releases power and activates angelic assignments (Psalm 103:20).
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(7:13 – 8:46) The Armor is Frontal: No Room for Cowardice

- All armour is for the front—indicating offensive, not defensive, engagement.
 - Faith must be **activated**; nothing in the spirit realm is automatic.
 - Presumption without activation is deception.
 - Analogy: Tending a garden—if not nurtured, weeds take over.
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(8:48 – 14:36) Faith Requires Obedience and Activation

- **1 Timothy 6:12 (KJV)** – *"Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life..."*
 - Faith is:
 - A relationship with Christ.
 - Obedience to His Word and Spirit-led instruction.
 - Kingdom authority is like a license—only valid within the rules of the kingdom.
 - Disciples grew in faith through obedience.
 - Faith must be **God's command**, not personal interpretation.
 - Faith includes forgiveness, love, and avoiding offense—these are not optional.
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(14:37 – 15:38) Know the Enemy and His Strategy

- The enemy is always plotting to:
 - Break our faith.
 - Undermine confidence in God's integrity.
 - Reference:

1 Peter 5:8 (TPT) – *"Be well balanced and always alert because your enemy, the devil, roams around incessantly like a roaring lion looking for its prey to devour."*
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(15:39 – 17:42) The Fiery Darts: Fear, Stress, Worry

- These darts attack us in the **spirit realm**, trying to suffocate our faith.
 - God has already provided everything we need:
 - **Psalms 139:16 (NKJV)** – *"...in Your book they all were written, the days fashioned for me, when as yet there were none of them."*
 - **Jeremiah 29:11 (NIV)** – *"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."*
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(17:43 – 18:08) Morning Warfare

- The speaker advises **dealing with the enemy first thing each day**—shutting him down in Jesus' name.
 - We must proactively confront the invisible realm or be overrun by it.
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(18:09 – 22:56) The Strategy of the Enemy

- Scripture reference:

Psalms 59:3 (TPT) – *"See how they set an ambush for my life. Fierce men are launching their attack against me..."*
 - The enemy **sets ambushes** against us to dim our light, suppress our purpose, and make us ineffective.
 - Understanding the enemy's plans through Scripture empowers us to counter them with God's armour and truth.

- **Faith is active obedience**, not passive belief.

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(22:57 – 24:47) Ambushes and Offenses: Recognizing Spiritual Setups

- Believers are warned to recognize ambushes that come in the form of offense, irritation, or unexpected emotional reactions.
- The enemy manipulates people to trigger others into offense—illustrated by a man who enjoyed deliberately upsetting strangers.
- These acts create a **ripple effect**, spreading offense, negativity, and spiritual oppression.
- The devil uses such individuals to stir up environments and distract or wound believers.

Psalms 59:3 (TPT) – “See how they set an ambush for my life. Fierce men are ready to launch their attack against me. O Lord, I’m innocent; protect me!”

(24:48 – 26:10) Get Ahead of the Pit: Recognize and Confront Vulnerabilities

- Jesus gave us authority and the **keys of the Kingdom** (symbolizing rule and dominion).

Matthew 16:19 (KJV) – “And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.”

Matthew 18:18 (KJV) – “Verily I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever ye shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.”

- The devil digs pits in the areas where we are most easily offended.
- Believers must take initiative—write down areas where they are easily angered or vulnerable; those are likely areas for ambushes.

Proverbs 26:27 (TPT) – “Go ahead—set a trap for others—and then watch as it snaps back on you! Start a landslide and you’ll be the one who gets crushed.”

(26:11 – 29:45) Break the Cycle: Avoid Ignorance of the Enemy’s Plans

- Arguments and strife stir up demonic activity.

2 Timothy 2:23-24 (KJV) – “But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strife’s. And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient.”

- Ambushes are designed to destroy every area of your life—health, finances, creativity, joy, relationships.
- If you don’t reverse a trap, you fall into it; spiritual ignorance is dangerous.

Hosea 4:6 (KJV) – “My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge.”

- The Word and knowledge of spiritual laws provide the tools to reverse satanic traps.

Psalm 35:8–10 (TPT) –

“Surprise them with your ambush, Lord, and catch them in the very trap they set for me. Let them be the ones to fail and fall into destruction.

Then my fears will dissolve into limitless joy; my whole being will overflow with gladness because of your mighty deliverance.

Everything inside of me will shout it out: There’s no one like you, Lord! For look at how you protect the weak and helpless from the strong and heartless who oppress them.”

Psalm 57:6 (TPT) –

“They have set a trap for me. Frantic fear has me overwhelmed. But look—the very trap they set for me has sprung shut upon themselves instead of me!”

(29:46 – 31:15) Recognize the Spirit of Fear

- Fear is a **spirit** and a tactic of the enemy—not a natural feeling for believers.

2 Timothy 1:7 (KJV) – “For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.”

- Fear, anxiety, and stress are satanic attempts to **white-ant** (undermine from within) your faith in God’s integrity.
- Important diagnostic questions:
 - Am I standing on a revealed word from God?

- Has this word become alive in me through revelation?
 - Is it part of my active lifestyle or am I just assuming?
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(31:16 – 33:21) Strengthen Yourself with the Word of God

- The attacks (darts of fear, anxiety, stress) are the enemy's last resort—meaning he's already on the back foot.
 - When spiritual heaviness is sensed, we must speak to it—**tell the cloud to move.**
 - Believers must grow to spiritual maturity so that they can recognize and respond to these attacks without needing external help.
 - Identifying “what ticks you off” helps expose your biggest open doors.
 - The enemy exploits emotional and spiritual weak points relentlessly.
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(33:22 – 34:38) The Evil Day Requires Active Resistance

- The devil is strategic—he plans detailed ambushes long in advance (like the real-world example of Israel's premeditated strike on Iran).
- Believers must prepare spiritually to stand firm when the evil day arrives.

Ephesians 6:13–14 (AMPC) –

“Therefore put on God's complete armour, that you may be able to resist and stand your ground on the evil day [of danger]; and, having done all [the crisis demands], to stand [firmly in your place].

Stand therefore [hold your ground], having tightened the belt of truth...”

(34:40 – 38:08) Scripture is Your Proven Weaponry

- Hold fast to truths like:
 - “I am redeemed”
 - “I am protected by the blood”
 - “I have the armies of heaven at my disposal”

Psalms 107:2 (KJV) – “Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, whom he hath redeemed from the hand of the enemy.”

- David refused to wear Saul’s untested armour—he used what had worked: his **staff and sling**.
- Similarly, every believer should know what scriptures are **personally alive and proven** in their life.
- Action Step:
 - Write a list of:
 - Scriptures that consistently work for you.
 - Scriptures needed to cover your personal weak points.
- Meditate on them until they become **revelation, alive, and effective**.

Joshua 1:8 (KJV) – “This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night... for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.”

Psalms 1:2 (KJV) – “But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.”

- Meditation leads to revelation, which leads to activation of spiritual power.
- Elijah and the king of Syria (2 Kings 6:8) will be discussed next as a biblical example of spiritual ambushes and divine strategy.

- The devil sets ambushes in the areas where you are **most offended** or emotionally volatile.

(38:09 – 44:40) Ambushes, Councils of Darkness, and Angelic Partnership

- The example of **2 Kings 6:8–10** is introduced: the King of Syria strategized ambushes, but the prophet **Elisha**, by the Spirit of God, revealed the enemy’s plans to Israel’s king in advance.

- This shows how God provides **pre-emptive warnings** through His Spirit to avoid destruction.

2 Kings 6:9 (paraphrased) – “Immediately Elisha warned the king of Israel... ‘Don’t go near that place, for the Syrians are planning to mobilize their troops there.’”

- The spiritual realm mirrors military strategy:
 - Satan’s kingdom operates as an organized **council** with delegated responsibilities.
 - They plot traps like fear, financial worry, oppression, and discouragement.

Matthew 12:25–26 (KJV) – “...Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation... And if Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself; how shall then his kingdom stand?”

- The Holy Spirit has been **commissioned** to reveal the Father’s plans to believers.

John 16:13 (KJV) – “Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth... and he will shew you things to come.”

- Angels are assigned to believers to assist in their divine destiny.

Hebrews 1:14 (KJV) – “Are they not all ministering spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?”

- Believers will one day **judge the angels** (1 Corinthians 6:3), indicating our spiritual responsibility to discern and activate their help now.

(44:42 – 47:35) Variation in Spiritual Relationship and Communication with God

- God’s dealings with His children are **varied** and **personalized**—just like spiritual gifts and ministries.
 - Different believers may exhibit **gifts of healing** in different forms (e.g., healing deafness vs. blindness), according to God’s administration.
 - **Psalms 91:1 (KJV)** – “He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.”
 - *Dwell* implies **constant communion**, not temporary visitation.
 - Everyone’s relationship with God may be unique—what matters is **authenticity and obedience**, not imitation.
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(47:35 – 50:19) A Personal Word: Constant Union with the Holy Spirit

- The speaker testifies that after years of structured morning “quiet time,” the Holy Spirit prompted him to **fellowship 24/7**.
 - “You leave Me behind when you walk out the door.”
- This redefined his spiritual walk into **continuous communion** rather than scheduled devotion.
- Faithfulness to personal instruction brings spiritual intimacy and fruit.

Romans 8:14 (KJV) – “For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.”

- As in marriage, each believer’s walk with the Lord is **intimate and exclusive**, not to be copied or compared.

(50:21 – 52:52) Dangers of Comparison and Spiritual Pride

- **Comparing oneself to others** leads to spiritual pride, which results in downfall.

Proverbs 16:18 (KJV) – “Pride goes before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall.”

Isaiah 14:12–15 (not quoted but implied): Lucifer fell because of pride.

- Instead, compare your life to your **obedience** to God's personal calling.
- Continuing with **2 Kings 6:11–18**:
 - The King of Syria was confused how Israel knew his plans.
 - His officials explained that **Elisha** knew even what he said in private.
 - The king sent troops by **night** to surround Elisha in Dothan.
 - Elisha's servant panicked, but Elisha prayed:

2 Kings 6:16–17 (KJV) – “Fear not: for they that be with us are more than they that be with them. And Elisha prayed... And, behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha.”

- Elisha prayed for the army to be struck blind—and it was.

(52:53 – 54:49) Led by the Spirit and Activating Angelic Help

- **Romans 8:14** is referenced again: being led by the Spirit includes inner witness and divine direction.

- When dwelling in God's presence, believers are **positioned in divine alignment** for angelic help.
- The Word of God **released from your mouth** activates angels:

Psalms 103:20 (KJV) – “Bless the Lord, ye his angels... that do his commandments, hearkening unto the voice of his word.”

- Prayer example:
 - Declare: “I release the hosts of heaven assigned to me for supernatural intervention... in Jesus’ name.”

(54:51 – 56:36) Daily Angelic Protection Prayers

- Specific decrees to activate protection:
 - Bind all demonic strategies using traffic, people, animals, or weather.
 - Loose angelic hosts under the authority of Christ to enforce divine protection.
- This spiritual preparation takes less than **7 minutes**, yet it positions you for divine success and covering throughout the day.

Key Takeaways

- Just as Elisha received divine insight, **you too can know the enemy’s strategies through the Holy Spirit.**
- God’s spiritual army is **strategically organized** and available to serve you in warfare.
- **Personalize your relationship** with God—don’t mimic others but deepen your own walk.
- Speak **revelatory scriptures** to activate angels, resist ambushes, and walk securely.
- Comparison and pride open spiritual traps—focus on **obedience and alignment** to your calling.

(56:37 – 57:29) Elisha’s Supernatural Strategy

- Elisha continues to demonstrate divine wisdom: after blinding the Syrian army, he leads them into Samaria (enemy territory).

- Once there, he prays again for their eyes to be opened. They find themselves surrounded but are shown mercy.
- Elisha refuses to kill the enemies and instead advises feeding them.

2 Kings 6:22 (KJV) – “And he answered, Thou shalt not smite them: would thou smite those whom thou hast taken captive with thy sword and with thy bow? set bread and water before them, that they may eat and drink, and go to their master.”

- The mercy shown leads to peace—**the Syrian raiders ceased attacks** for a time.
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(57:31 – 1:00:41) Siege of Samaria & Carnal Thinking

- Later, Syria returns with a full-scale siege, causing **severe famine** in Samaria.

2 Kings 6:25 (KJV) – “And there was a great famine in Samaria: and behold, they besieged it, until an ass’s head was sold for fourscore pieces of silver...”

- Elisha remains in spiritual authority, **meeting with the elders** (decision-makers).
- Speaker draws parallels to political councils like President Trump and his cabinet—demonstrating that **strategy is spiritual, not random**.
- The disciples also experienced resistance after receiving divine instructions (Matthew 8:23–27).
 - The storm was intended to **oppose God's Word**, but speaking the Word would have stilled it.

Isaiah 55:11 (KJV) – “So shall my word be that goes forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void...”

- Key principle: **God’s Word is on assignment** and carries the power of fulfillment if we activate it by faith.
 - If the disciples had spoken the word, they would not have been “scathed.”
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(1:00:41 – 1:08:47) Counsel vs. Confusion

- Wise counsel builds faith; gossip and flattery breed confusion.
- Good counsel provides challenge, insight, and depth—not just agreement.
- Speaker likens the **Body of Christ to a team**, where every part contributes its skill, much like administrative departments of a government.

Ephesians 4:16 (KJV) – “From whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplies...”

- God calls people to specific assignments—**our job is to obey, not seek approval from others.**
- Elisha discerns another ambush when the king sends a messenger to kill him.
 - Elisha knows beforehand and instructs the elders to block the messenger.
 - The king arrives angry, blaming God for the siege and famine.

2 Kings 7:1 (KJV) – “Then Elisha said, Hear ye the word of the Lord; Thus saith the Lord, Tomorrow about this time shall a measure of fine flour be sold for a shekel...”

- The officer mocks the prophecy. Elisha warns: **“You will see it, but not eat of it.”**
- Four lepers, outside the gates, choose to surrender to the Syrians.
 - When they arrive, the enemy camp is deserted—God had sent supernatural sounds to make the Syrians flee.

2 Kings 7:6 (KJV) – “For the Lord had made the host of the Syrians to hear a noise of chariots, and a noise of horses...”

- Lepers rejoice, hoard, then realize the need to share the good news.
- The **king suspects a trap**—a classic example of **carnal, fear-based thinking.**

(1:08:47 – 1:10:18) The Fulfillment of Prophecy

- Just as Elisha prophesied, the food becomes available the next day at affordable prices.
- The officer who doubted God is **trampled at the city gate**—he saw the miracle but did not partake of it.

2 Kings 7:19–20 (KJV) – “...Behold, thou shalt see it with thine eyes, but shalt not eat thereof. And so it fell out... for the people trod upon him in the gate, and he died.”

- The speaker emphasizes: **satanic strategies are explicit and strategic**, meant to trap the faithless.
- But those who abide in the Word can escape and triumph.

(1:10:19 – 1:13:18) Union with the Holy Spirit Is the Source of Victory

- Return to **Ephesians 6** – the **armour of God** is available to those who have **union with the Holy Spirit**.

Ephesians 6:10 (TPT) – “Be supernaturally infused with strength through your life union with the Lord Jesus. Stand victorious with the force of his explosive power flowing in and through you.”

- God’s grace is our power supply.

2 Corinthians 12:9 (KJV) – “And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness...”

- When believers are stretched beyond capacity, they should:
 1. Ask for grace (supernatural enabling).
 2. Rely on union with the Holy Spirit, not fleshly strength.
 3. Speak the Word boldly.
- The armour is worn on the front, which indicates **moving forward, not retreating**.
- When you're in the **secret place**, God becomes your **rear guard**.

Isaiah 52:12 (KJV) – “...for the Lord will go before you; and the God of Israel will be your rereward [rear guard].”

Key Takeaways

- **Praise and thanksgiving** usher in the Lord’s presence, bringing clarity and strength.
- **Spiritual traps** are real and targeted—but the Word and Holy Spirit provide strategies to avoid or reverse them.

(1:13:19 – 1:15:37) Setting a Spiritual Defence Before the Battle

- Before engaging the day, believers must:
 - **Cover themselves with the blood of Jesus**
 - **Declare redemptive rights**
 - **Position the army of God (angelic hosts) to surround them**

Galatians 3:13–14 (TPT) –

“Yet Christ paid the full price to set us free from the curse of the law. He absorbed it completely as He became a curse in our place... And now through faith we receive the promised Holy Spirit.”

Psalms 34:7 (KJV) – “The angel of the Lord encamps round about them that fear him, and delivers them.”

Isaiah 60:18 (KJV) – “...thou shalt call thy walls Salvation, and thy gates Praise.”

(1:15:37 – 1:20:30) Understanding the Curse and Your Redemption

- The curse is detailed in **Deuteronomy 28:15–68**—poverty, sickness, destruction, fear, exile, and sorrow.
- But **Jesus absorbed the full curse on the cross** to give us redemption.
- God’s blessings (as promised to Abraham) now belong to all who are in Christ.

Deuteronomy 28:15 (KJV) – “...all these curses shall come upon thee, and overtake thee...”

Deuteronomy 28:58–68 details various horrific consequences of disobedience—plagues, disease, fear, loss of identity, exile, and bondage.

- Believers must:
 - Know what they’ve been redeemed from.
 - Enforce that truth through **spoken faith**: “Let the redeemed of the Lord say so” (Psalm 107:2).
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(1:20:31 – 1:24:51) Applying Redemption in Practice

- Stress, fear, pressure, anxiety, and oppression are all **manifestations of the curse**.
- Jesus came to **undo the works of Satan**.

Acts 10:38 (KJV) – “How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth... who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil...”

- When the believer believes the Word and acts on it, the angels of the Lord respond.
 - Believers must:
 - Write down areas of life where the curse has been active (e.g., broken relationships, fear of poverty).
 - Identify holes in their “spiritual dam” and plug them one by one through faith and obedience.
 - **Activate** the blessing of Abraham through the indwelling Holy Spirit and practical obedience.
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(1:24:51 – 1:25:59) Isaiah 54: The Promise of Divine Defence

Isaiah 54:15–17 (paraphrased) –

“If any nation comes to fight you, it will not be sent by Me... No weapon turned against you shall succeed... This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord...”

- The devil may form weapons or accusations (courtroom lies), but God promises to neutralize them.
- Ties into **Revelation 12:11** –

“And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.”

(1:26:01 – 1:30:27) Victory Over Ambushes and Lies

- God’s promise in Isaiah 54:
 - The attacks will **fail**.
 - God has already built-in plans for **your deliverance**.
 - You will receive **justice** in the courtroom of heaven against every lie or demonic ambush.
- The “smith” who forms the weapons and “armies that destroy” were also created by God. He controls all.
- Return to **Luke 18:1–8** – the parable of the **persistent widow and unjust judge**:

- The widow represents the believer crying for **justice**, not vengeance.
- God promises He will bring about justice **swiftly**.

Luke 18:1–3 (KJV) –

“...Men ought always to pray, and not to faint... There was in a city a judge... And there was a widow... saying, Avenge me of mine adversary.”

- Key principle: **Do not seek revenge**, seek **justice**. Let God handle vengeance.

Romans 12:19 (KJV) – “Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.”

(1:30:28 – 1:30:59) The Danger of Unforgiveness and the Trap of Vengeance

- Holding onto pain, offense, and bitterness keeps you **in spiritual prison**.
- **Matthew 18:34–35** warns that those who don’t forgive are turned over to tormentors.
- **Buried emotional pain** is still alive—it festers and opens doors to demonic torment.
- Healing begins with **forgiveness**.
- Seeking revenge keeps you out of God’s courtroom. Seeking justice invites God’s help.

- You must actively **set your spiritual defence daily** through:
 - Praise
 - Declaring redemptive rights

(1:30:00 – 1:32:06) Fight on God's Terms – Seek Justice, Not Revenge

- We are not to fight the enemy **on his terms**, but through:
 - The **blood of Jesus**
 - Our **righteous position in Christ**
 - The **presence of God**

Luke 18:3–5 (paraphrased) – The persistent widow demanded **justice** (not vengeance) from the unjust judge and was eventually granted her request because of her persistence.

Romans 12:19 (KJV) – “Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.”

- We must **demand justice** as our spiritual right, not retaliate.
 - Persistence in prayer—faith that does not quit—is the pathway to vindication.
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(1:32:06 – 1:33:33) God Responds to Undying Faith

Luke 18:7–8 (TPT) – “Don’t you know that God, the true judge, will grant justice to all His chosen ones who cry out to Him night and day? He will not delay...”

- Justice comes when we persist in faith, refusing to give up.
 - Jesus challenges: “When the Son of Man comes, will He find this kind of undying faith on the earth?”
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(1:33:34 – 1:35:38) Prayer Strategy: National and Personal

- How to pray effectively:
 - Pray for nations, governments, and leaders to receive **righteous counsel**.
 - Release angelic forces to remove evil ambushments in leadership.
 - Apply **Matthew 6:10** in prayer:
“Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in [my country/state] as it is in heaven.”
- Believers are assigned to pray not only for themselves but also for **federal, state, and local authorities**.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to guide prayer targets and assignments—**assignments bring anointing**.

- The devil's priority is to **waste your time** and prevent effectiveness.
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(1:35:39 – 1:36:34) Assigning Angels Before You Sleep

- You can release angelic protection before sleep.
 - Angels work even while you sleep—**ministering spirits assigned to believers** (Hebrews 1:14).
 - Declare: “I release angels to protect my night, minister to me, and set up the day ahead.”
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(1:36:35 – 1:39:55) Cowardice vs. Courage in the Face of Ambush

- Armor protects the **front**, not the back—retreat is not an option.
- **Fear and cowardice are traps.**

Revelation 21:8 (KJV) – “But the fearful, and unbelieving... shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire...”

- Endure like the martyrs: the grace of God is **sufficient** in pressure.

Philippians 1:28 (AMPC) – “And do not for a moment be frightened... [it will be] a clear sign... of their impending destruction... and your deliverance.”

- Example: **Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego** refused to bow to the king’s idol.
 - Even if God didn’t deliver, they wouldn’t compromise.
 - Result: God walked with them in the fire (Daniel 3:25).
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(1:40:03 – 1:42:44) Praying in the Spirit: A Front-Foot Strategy

- Use **tongues to tear down ambushments**.

1 Corinthians 14:2 (KJV) – “He that speaks in an unknown tongue speaks not unto men, but unto God... he speaks mysteries.”

- Ask the Holy Spirit:
 - “Tear up every ambush ahead of me.”
 - “Position me for divine success.”
 - “Give me the words to connect with my reward.”

Deuteronomy 28:6 (KJV) – “Blessed shalt thou be when thou come in, and blessed shalt thou be when thou goes out.”

- Prayer should be **targeted, strategic, and persistent**—decrees release the power.

(1:42:47 – 1:45:06) Stop Putting Out Fires: Get Ahead of the Enemy

- If you spend your day reacting to problems, you're **not building anything**.
- Fires of anxiety, fear, and stress **destroy spiritual productivity**.
- Instead, start your day in prayer, deal with the enemy **before the day begins**, and even **project into your week and month**.

Romans 4:24 (KJV) – The blessing of righteousness was not just for Abraham, “but for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe...”

John 17:20 (KJV) – “Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word.”

- Jesus prayed **generational prayers**—we are to do the same.

(1:45:11 – 1:47:52) The Sword of the Spirit: Spoken Word with Power

- The **Sword of the Spirit** is the **spoken Word of God**, wielded in partnership with the Holy Spirit.

Revelation 19:15 (KJV) – “And out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should smite the nations...”

Romans 1:16 (KJV) – “For I am not ashamed of the gospel... for it is the power of God unto salvation...”

Romans 10:17 (KJV) – “So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.”

Hebrews 12:2 (KJV) – “Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith...”

- The Word of God **is Jesus** (John 1:1). You can't pursue faith apart from Jesus.
- Faith comes **by obeying His Word**, not just listening or studying it.

Luke 17:5 (KJV) – “And the apostles said unto the Lord, Increase our faith.”

- This was in response to Jesus commanding them to forgive.
- Obedience to the Word is what **activates and increases** faith.

Hebrews 10:35 (KJV) – “Cast not away therefore your confidence, which has great reward.”

- Hebrews 11 showcases **faith heroes**, but they died **without receiving the full promise**.
- Now, under the New Covenant, **we have access to something better**: faith's fullness.
- The Old Testament provides powerful examples of faith, but the **New Testament equips us** for daily kingdom victory.
- Don't live in spiritual firefighting mode—live in **fruitful advancement**.

Philippians 4:6 (KJV) – “Be careful [anxious] for nothing...”

(1:51:35 – 1:54:55) Living Out God’s Destiny, Not Your Own

Hebrews 12:1–2 (TPT) –

“We must let go of every wound... and the sin we so easily fall into. Then we will be able to run life’s marathon race... We look away from the natural realm and focus... unto Jesus...”

- You will give an account for fulfilling **His plan for your life**, not your own plan.
- Focus your attention on **Jesus**, not on natural distractions.

Matthew 6:33 (KJV) – “But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness...”

- Jesus endured the cross knowing it would **redeem you**.
 - **Hebrews 12:3 (TPT)** – “So consider carefully how Jesus faced such intense opposition... so that you won’t become worn down and cave in...”
